Namaste. It is my great privilege and honor to welcome the community at large to Bharatiya Temple and



Cultural Center on this auspicious occasion of Philadelphia Ganesh Festival of 2014. During ten days of grand celebrations of Ganesh Mahotsava, the whole temple complex becomes live with thousands of people participating in daily spiritual / religious programs and enjoying memorable cultural events. Ganesh Mahotsava has become a hall mark tradition at Bharatiya Temple for last ten years uniting the diverse Indian community in the tri-state area and performing seva to lord Ganesha with utmost devotion. During peak times of festivities elaborate off-site parking arrangements have been made for your convenience. Parking in the Kingston Knoll development has been restricted by the Township. Please do not park on the Countyline road and in the development where not permitted, to avoid fines and car

towing.

On behalf of the Board of Directors and Board of Trustees, I want to sincerely thank all sponsors, supporters, coordinators and scores of volunteers for all help in bringing this anxiously awaited festivity at Bharatiya temple. I also thank many area organizations and restaurants for their active participation and support.

As general Temple updates, construction for Indianization of the temple building started in April this year

and is going on with full speed. Installation of GFRC claddings for five Shikhars is almost complete and work on the main Shikhar and south style Vimana is going on now. Fabrication and installation of beautiful window claddings and the EIFIS system on the exterior walls has also started. Granite temple sign with Indian architecture and carvings is planned to be completed before the start of Ganesh Mahotsava. Architectural and engineering design for the Rajagopuram structure in the front of the temple building is in progress and construction is planned to start later this year. Finally the celebration of Kumbhabhishek Mahotsava is scheduled in the second half of 2015. This will mark the completion of the next important mile stone of Bharatiya Temple project.



During construction activities we had many roof leakage problems causing some water damage on temple floor in spite of extensive roof patch work. We plan to replace the complete roof after the completion of the construction activity for Shikhars, before winter this year. We also sincerely apologize for the inconvenience and the appearance during the construction period.

We have to continue with the fundraising efforts to close the current gap of about half million dollars in our construction budget. Please find the attached Kumbhabhishek Pledge form for the details of available sponsorship categories and take advantage of this opportunity to participate in the pledge drive today. We urgently need your one last time financial support to complete the Kumbhabhishek project within the projected time schedule. As an added incentive any sponsorship / donation of \$1000 or more will entitle you daily free archana during ten days of Ganesh Mahotsava.

This year, devotees have opportunity to sponsor 108 Kalash. Kalash will be ceremoniously carried by sponsors around deities and will be finally offered for Abhishek to Moola Murty of SiddhiVinayak. Grand Abhishek with Milk, Yogurt, Vibhuti, Chandan, Raktachandan, Ghee, Honey, Sugarcane Juice and Water will also be offered. The Abhishek will be performed in a very holy and spiritual atmosphere created by Rudra Chanting, Ganesh Mantra recitation and sonorous Shehnaii (Mangal Vadyam). Devotees will get once-in-year opportunity to offer Milk Abhishek to Lord SiddhiVinayak and Goddess Riddhi & Siddhi.

Significance of Abhishek

Sacred Texts describe Abhishek in relation to bliss experienced by Yogis. During meditation by Yogis, Kundalini Shakti rises from Moolaadhaara Chakra with the blessings from Ganapati. The Shakti rises further, through several other chakras like Manipoorakam, Swaadhistaanam, Anaagadham, etc., and the Naadam and Bindu Unites (Yogam). When such a state is reached, it is said a "Divine Nectar" (Amrut) flows from the head to the toes through all the parts of body of Yogi, giving a pleasant feeling of Bliss (Sachchidananda). This is literally described as "Abhishek". The Ganapati MahaAbhishek ceremony is symbolic representations of that "Sachchidananda Abishekam" for regular folks like us who have not achieved that state yet. Let's experience bliss and goose bumps in a very pious atmosphere, a delight to 6 senses, created by the collective chanting of Rudram, Ganesh Beej Mantra (Om Gam Ganapataye Namah), Ganapati AtharvaShirsha and melodious sound of Shehnai Mangalavadya, great Alankaram to Lord Ganesha, fragrance of Abhishek offerings & dhoopam and His darshan in lighted ghee lamps of Vasal Maalai.

First time PGF, we are offering MahaAbhishekam using 108 Mangal Kalash filled with holy water. The Kalash will be consecrated with invocation to Lord Ganesha and Goddess Riddhi & Siddhi. Devotees who sponsor the Kalash Puja will carry the Kalashas in a procession Appeal: Please place aside wallets, purses and belts etc. made of leather, before offering milk for Abhishek or carrying Kalashas. Morning ritual bath is required & traditional Indian attire is suggested. Your cooperation in this regard is greatly appreciated.

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


his talent under the guidance of Late Pandit A.T.Kanan and legend Pandit Bhimsen Joshi.



Significance of Vivah (Kalyanam) in Hindu Tradition

The Hindu Vivah (Wedding) Ceremony has a number of rituals and religious steps. These steps have deep significance. However since many people do not know the significance, they try to speed up the rituals and do not give a deserving importance. In Hindu tradition, wedding is much more than just bride and the groom taking vows to belong to one another eternally. Marriage is considered the strongest social bond where two families join. The ceremony is conducted according to the ancient Vedic wisdome. Amongst Hindus, marriage is meant to merge two souls into one harmonious whole, as the Bride and Groom enter Grihasthashram (home life). It is a colorful event, with a lifelong promise between two individuals and their families. Devataa Vivahas have some steps that are different than Human Vivah, but such weddings of deities are performed to insure that our next generation gets blessed with a deep knowledge of significance of wedding steps and their own path of married life becomes free of obstacles.

Reference for Ganesh Vivah (Kalyanam) in Puranas

Some consider Ganesha as a brahmacharin. However, Shiv Puran, Ganesh Puran have ample references of Lord Mayureshwar, an incarnation of Lord Ganesha in Tretayuga getting married with Lord Brahma's twin daughters, Goddesses Riddhi & Siddhi. Ganesha is said to be blessed with two sons Shubh & Labh. Ganesh Puran mentions that whoever performs Ganesh, Riddhi, Siddhi Vivaha, Lord Ganesha blesses them with boons from Riddhi & Siddhi. Some may ask why does Ganesha has 2 wives when having 2 wives is not an acceptable practice today. Goddess Siddhi (power to work hard) acts on Ganesha's commands and performs any hard task very easily. However, unless you have intellect (Riddhi which signifies a power to think and make right choices) to go along with your physical energy (Siddhi), one can not achieve a welfare of family and the mankind. To demonstrate this fact, our scriptures tell this story of Ganesha having 2 wives.

Wedding is not a wedding without the sonorous and fun filled weddings songs sung enthusiastically by participating relatives. In this event, we all are going to be relatives of Ganesha and Riddhi Siddhi. Women and children from Marathi, Gujarati, Tamil, Bengali, Telugu, Kannada, Hindi and Punjabi communities will sing wedding songs to mark every important wedding ritual step taken by Lord Ganesha and Goddess Riddhi & Siddhi



in this wedding. They will be accompanied on Tabla by **Rahul Palnitkar** who has been performing incredible seva in Bharatiya Temple for past few years. Wedding Songs will be sung by Bharatiya Vidyalaya Kids, Marathi Group, Gujarati Group, Bihari Group, Telugu Group, Kannada Group, Tamil Group & UP group.

Ganesh Vivah Significance and Steps		
1. Vigneshwar & Gauri Pujan	Vighneshwar form of Lord Ganesha removes the obstacles. He is worshipped for this purpose not only during the Ganesh Vivah ceremony but also during the entire married life. Girls traditionally worship Aadishakti Gauri to be blessed with suitable handsome match.	
2.PunyahVachanam	Punyahavachana is performed to remove our bad thoughts & also purifying the place of the ceremony.	
3.Swasti Vachanamand Vara Agamanam	Welcome Groom Lord Ganesha in Palkhi & offer Worship to him, also the feet of the groom (Ganesha) is washed by bride's father to welcome the groom as MahaVishnu himself and the bride as MahaLakshmi herself.	
4.Yagyopaveetam Dharmam	Offering Sacred Thread to Lord Ganesha	
5.Madhuparka Puja	Madhuparkam is a part of the aforesaid ritual. It has the bride's father offering a mixture of curd, gee and honey to the groom. Curd, ghee and honey, all are considered to be good for one's health. Besides, these edibles are believed to be auspicious and impart good effects to whatsoever associated with it.	
6.Gau Danam	Holy Cow is given to Lord Ganesha	
7. Vadhu (Kanya) Agamanam (Riddhi, Siddhi)	Welcome to Goddesses Riddhi & Suddhi in Palkhi and pujan. The bride is escorted to the Mandap by her maternal uncles. An Antarpat (screen) separates the bride and the groom as a symbol of their separate existence prior to the marriage ceremony and it is removed after prayers to the Supreme.	
8. MahaSankalp, Antarpathanam Mangalashtakam	Main Wedding Ceremony, holding a sacred partition cloth between brides and groom and then reciting auspicious 8 stanzas of Lord's praise. The priest and community elders recites eight special mantras to invoke the presence of the gods, who sanctify the ceremonial site and the surroundings, and bless the couple with a happy and healthy wedded life. As part of the Mangalashtak, eight verses are recited. The following provides a sense of their meaning: "Just as the holy rivers of India become one as they meet the ocean and remain united, we pray that similarly the bride and groom's lives unite and become one filled with joy and happiness."	
9.Mala Dharmam (Garland Exchange)	Bride and Groom exchange the Garlands signifying accepting the other as a better half. Usually the assistants and friends try to delay the exchange but the groom and brides want to complete this important step that signifies completion of wedding. Significance: The bride and the groom are lifted to the shoulders and in that position the two garlands each other thrice for a complete union. A garland worn by a person should	
	not be used by another, ordain our shastras. Here the exchange of garlands symbolizes their unification – as one soul in two bodies. It is inward acceptance by each of the very fragrance of the other.	



Ganesh Vivah Steps (Contnued...)

10.Kanyadanam & Raksha Bandhan (Dashadanam)	In this portion of the ceremony, the bride's parents give their consent for the wedding to proceed and for their daughter to be given away as a lifelong companion. The bride and the groom then hold hands and take vows to love, cherish, and protect each other throughout life. Giving daughter's hand to groom for future prosperity in his family is the most sacred help that bride's family offers for which grooms family is eternally grateful.
11.Mangalya Pooja (soubhagya Ashirwad), Mangalya Dharanam	The groom offers and ties Mangal Sutra to brides Invoking Godess Lakshmi in to the Mangalsutra to give all kind of Aishwarya in the house (Asta Aishwarya) Mangal Sutra is offered to the bride by the groom. It is symbolic of his enduring love, commitment, dedication, and devotion.
12. Akshta Ropanam	Akshata Ropanam is when the bride and groom express their expectations and aspirations for one another. The bride's father then takes the couples hands and the family showers the couple with rose petals and grains of rice.
13. Shodasha Upacahar Pooja/ Yajman Ashirwad	Wedding Attendees and devotees offer wedding gifts, Vastrams to newly wed brides and groom.
14.Shodasha Upachara Puja	This is done for devatas only and not in human wedding. Newly wed couple if offered full-length worship and offerings. Special Pujas are offered to the newly married Couple with 16 verities of welcoming (Shodasha Upachara)
	Seeking blessings from newly wed and happy Lord Ganesha and his 2 wives. Significance: The priest, the family members, and the friends of the bride and the groom, offer their blessings to the newly married couple by showering yellow rice.
15Mangala Arati	Short mangal Aarti offered by 5 married and blessed women to Newly wed couple.
	Significance: A solution of lime and turmeric powder, and in color, is prepared on a plate, and circled around the couple and thrown away to ward off evil eye. This is done a number of times during the entire wedding ceremony, and at the end.
16.Vijaya Yatra (Procesion)	Newly Married couple goes out in Grand procession. Our Dhol-Tasha Pathak will lead the procession. Procession will go around the temple.
17.Ganasha, Sarvadevata Aarti & Prasad	Sukha Karta Dukha Harta & Om Jai Jagadish Hare Aarti Laddu Prasadam to all.

2 Dhol-Tasha Pathaks (Jallosh, NJ and PGF) in Ganesh Vivah Vijay Yatra, 12:00 noon



die. He is the most remixed music composer and his music is live in the minds of the listener even today.



Traditional Ganesh festival is not complete without Jyestha, Kanishtha Gauri (Mahalakshmi) puja. Gauri Puja been a tradition in Maharashtra and neighboring states. In south, similar vratam called Shodash Uma Vratam is popular. Newly married women return to their mother's home and worship Jyestha & Kanishtha Gauris. This festival is marked by women's singing, dances and Haldi-Kumkum gathering to wish each other prosperity and happiness.

Significance of Jyeshtha Kanishtha Gauri (Maha Lakshmi) Pujan

Jyeshtha and Kanishtha are sisters called Mahalakshmi in Central India. They are called Gauris in Western Coastal belt. Some treat them as mother Parvati and Lakshmi coming to earth since they dearly miss Ganesha who comes for 10 days to devotees homes. Ling Puran (Uttarbhag ch.6) and Padma Puran (Uttarkhanda 6.116) refer Jyestha (Alakshmi) as an elder daughter of Ocean because she emerged first and Kanishtha (Lakshmi) as a younger daughter who emerged later when grand ocean churning was performed by Devas and Asuras. Alakshmi is opposite of Lakshmi. Both are said to be created by Vishnu as matter and anti-matter. Some philosophers see the troublesome Jyestha as a help, developing detachment in a person while worship of Lakshmi leads to attachment. Several religious scriptures like Streedharmapaddhati tell about a decree by Lord Vishnu that every married woman should offer small offering to Jyeshtha (Alakshmi) before partaking food so she stays away from their home. Chaturvarga Chintamni (2.2) says that men should worship Jyeshtha to seek prosperity for their wives and children. ShabdaKalpadruma (1.1) suggests worship of Jyeshtha before Diwali so misfortune stays away from home. Recitation of SriSuktam helps keep Lakshmi in the home while Alakshmi stays away. Baudhayan Grihya Sutra (Q3,Ch9) from Taittiriya Krishna Yajurveda (800 B.C.) devotes a full chapter on Jyeshtha Pujan Vidhi. Since both are daughter of Ocean, at many places they are brought home from a pond. Devotees are blessed by Jyestha when she is given an offering. A ritual visarjan on 3rd day insures she stays away from home for the year. Kanishtha (Lakshmi) is also worshipped at the same time since she is always wanted by families for year round prosperity and wealth. Both reside in Ashwath (Peepal) tree with MahaVishnu. We are going to set up Standing Gauris. Our volunteers have brought special steel structures, faces and body limbs to set-up the Gauris as life size vigrahas. Pratishthapana will be done on 1st day. Elaborate Pujan, offering of multiple sweets, 16-vegitables etc are offered on 2nd day and Visarjan is done on 3rd day. Please do not miss the Haldi Kumkum event for women at 7:30pm on Sept 2, 2014.

Haldi Kumkum is a fun filled bonding meeting of girls and women. Haldi and Kumkum, the most holy powders offered to Lord Vishnu and Lakshmi, are considered auspicious. When women apply Haldi and Kumkum to each other's forehead, they honor manifestation of Goddess Lakshmi (Saubhagyada) in each others and wish good fortune (Saubhagya) to each



Sri T H Subash Chandran is a multi-percussionist, performing





Mr. Suryaksh Deshpande – Tabla .Disciple of Pt. Arvind Mulgaonkar and Famous table Artist from NJ



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

USTAD NISHAT KHAN Sitar Maestro

Sounded soul which is the origin of the Lord Ganesha is the self existent everlasting unexpressed total universal divine knowledge. The three states creation, maintenance (taking care) and destruction are originated from Lord Ganesha (Matter is originated from sound. The protons, neutrons and electrons are made up of atom. Atom is made from matter.) Proton, the creator (God Brahma), neutron the care-taker (God Vishnu) and electron the destructor (God Shiva). The five elements are originated from Lord Ganesha. From Ether the air is originated, from air the fire is originated, from fire the water is originated, from water the earth is originated. A human being is also originated from these five elements by processing cosmic energy. Lord Ganesha is the self existent original sounded soul. The knowledge of sound is visible or invisible. We can hear it but cannot see or feel it. Lord Ganesha (sound) is soul and the universe is the body. The source of words is from Lord Ganesha -the original sound. The four states of speeches are para, pashyanti, madhyama and vaikhari. The place of para is deep down inside the region of naval. The place of pashyanti is in the heart. The 'Madhvanma' is the throat and 'Vaikhari' is the movement of tongue and lips. It means the presence of Lord Ganesha (sound) is present in all the objects in the world.

You are beyond the three human qualities (Raj, Satva, and Tam). You are beyond thethree human states (waking, dreaming and deep sleep). You are beyond the three states of bodies (gross, stable and causal). You constantly exist in the place 'Muladhara' in human body. You are the three powers/ Shakti (required for creation, preservation and destruction). The sages always meditate on Lord Ganesha. You are Brahma, you are Vishnu, you are Rudra, you are Indra, you are Agni/ God of Fire, you are Vayu/God of Air, you are Surya/Sun, you are Chandra/Moon, you are the Brahma (an organism from all living being) and the Earth, the Sky, the Heaven and the OM. Human being has three types of qualities- Satva, Raj, and Tam. Satva means Satvik means pure, holy or God fearing. A person, who is satvik, has always pure, noble clear thoughts. He is always well behaved well mannered thinking for others. Any type of bad elements could not disturb him. 'Rajogna' means passionate. A person always thinks about what profit he will get if will do anything. He always accepts positive results as per his thinking. If he doesn't achieve it he gets disturb. Could not keep control on his thoughts and mind. 'Tamasi' means hot headed irascible. A person is very hot tempered, selfish, his thoughts and his world are around eating, drinking, sleeping. They hurt to others; never take care for anybodies feelings and duties towards anybody. Lord Ganesha is beyond these three gunas.

Lord Ganesha always exists in place of 'Muladhara'. According to the yoga there are seven 'Chakras'(states) in human body. These 'Chakras' are situated in various parts of the body. Through meditation a person can awake the power of thinking of body, correct decision power, through the power of kundalini which is in the 'Muladhara'. Lord Ganesha the supreme power is situated in 'Muladhara'.

Having recited the letter 'Ga' the first letter of 'Ganadhim' in the beginning, followed by the first alphabet 'A' and thereafter a dot means a crescent and with the sacred 'Om' up to these. This is the way of complete the pronunciation. 'Gakara' is the first part 'Akara' is the middle part and a dot 'anuswar' is the last part and 'bindu' is the latter form (pronunciation) .This is the 'Ganesh Vidya'(knowledge about Lord Ganesha) of Gananka Rishi (a sage) Niert Gayatri is its meter. 'Ganapati' is the God and symbolic form in words is 'OM Gam Ganapataye Namaha'. The word Gam having the following three parts, 1) ga 2) a 3) a dot above the letter to denote the nasal sound.

After finishing these three mantras a description of Ganesh idol for meditation is said as follows, Who has one tusk (on right side), who has four hands, in upper right hand who is holding noose, in left upper hand goad. In lower left hand, who is holding elephant's tooth(ekadanta), right lower hand is giving blessings, granting boon, having the mouse as him emblem, red in color, who is having big stomach, whose ears are like a small sift pan, who is wearing red colored cloths, who's body is smeared with red sandalwood paste, who is worshipped with red flowers, who is always does favor and keeps kindness towards his devotees, who created this world, who is everlasting and who is the cause of the universe, who is beyond the primordial energy and individual soul. Whoever meditates on him, always be a yogi and is the best amongst the yogis.
